

Thanks to all of the great folk who put together and provided for our annual **Trunk-or-Treat** and **Chicken Stew!** People really like to spend time outside, dress up in crazy costumes, gather buckets of candy, go on hay rides, and eat chicken stew, hotdogs and desserts! It takes a whole lot of people to make it all happen. It was a great night of fun, fellowship and food – a welcoming and hospitable embrace of our community, and lots of people thanked us for providing this safe opportunity to gather and celebrate. So, once again, thanks to all of you who work very hard, days and hours ahead of time, to prepare for and carry out this wonderful, loving, community event. You know who you are. And, if you are uncertain, you are the giants of our church upon whom we confidently and essentially, again and again, **FALL BACK**.

Years ago, my good friend Dr. Bob Scofield, directed me to *Project Adventure* – an organization providing training in Adventure Programming. Bob and Dauna attend the 11:00 a.m. service. At the time, Bob was the foremost authority and practitioner of adventure programming at **The Children's Home**. So, I signed up for a **Basic Adventure Program Course** which was held at the PA Campus in Covington, GA. It was there that I learned the concept of "*Challenge by Choice*"- meaning that everyone has the privilege of declining the challenge if it scares the daylights out of you! I like that! I use challenge-by-choice every Sunday when I say, "you can if you want to, but you don't have to if you don't want to." It is a highly technical and precise invitation, and there are times when Challenge Course participants opt out and choose to watch rather than participate.

The most memorable and highly used "equipment" on a challenge course is usually a tree stump or a very short telephone pole or a slightly elevated platform from which a person stands up straight, crosses her arms, (utters a brief prayer), and stiffly FALLS BACK into the waiting arms of her friends! Sound easy? It is not! Falling Back requires a great deal of trust in others whom you cannot see. Scary! Faith...in your friends; hope...that everyone will ACT out of a commitment to the Golden Rule (Do unto others) and the second of the Great Commandments (love your neighbor as yourself). Trust becomes greater than fear. Biblical love is NOT a mushy feeling, but a commitment to ACT in a loving way. Falling Back requires faith and hope that your friends will ACT! If your friends do not like you, that's okay, IF, in spite of their feelings, they will lovingly catch you before you hit the ground! Active love, not mush.

One of my favorite holidays of the season is FALL BACK! Well, it is not really a holiday, or a holy day, but it does always happen on a Sunday. And, it is one of my favorite Sundays of the year! On FALL BACK, we get to sleep an hour later. Usually happening near Halloween, FALL BACK often plays a trick on those not paying close attention. FALL BACK is an opportunity for those who are sleep-deprived to catch up a little bit. FALL BACK graciously allots sleepy-heads, procrastinators and parents of small children an additional hour to prepare for the day. Some people want to get rid of FALL BACK. Some of us want to make it a weekly observance!

FALL BACK 2025 will be observed at 2am on Sunday, November 2. There are increasing reasons for optimism as we move forward as a faith community. Here at Brookstown, we encourage participation on **FACEBOOK** at two of our services, for those who can't be here. There are lots of great sermons on the radio and TV, too. But, it's not the same as being present with others in worship.

In that spirit, allow me to extend a Challenge-By-Choice invitation. Brookstown Church is not the same when we are not together; so, you are invited to **FALL BACK** into the trusting arms of church and BRING A FRIEND! At church, we aim to practice agape – unconditional love – like God!

We promise to have your back. We will link hands and hearts, and try our very best not to let anyone hit the ground!


As we approach the holiday season, we look forward to sharing special events with our children, as they grow in their faith and understanding of Jesus's life and teachings.


A Prayer for Our Veterans
