Trees provide shade; sequester carbon and produce oxygen; bear food; provide fuel for warmth, light, and cooking; produce elements for medicines and materials for shelter. Some contend that trees "communicate" with each other. Trees certainly spoke to Joyce Kilmer. They speak to me. *Only God can make a tree*.

One of the prominent features of Brookstown Church's observance of the First Sunday in Advent are our trees! A highlight of the **Hanging of the Greens Service** is the lighting and placement of **Chrismons** on our Sanctuary Christmas Tree. Our tree is big, beautiful, historic, and occupies an upfront position in our seasonal decorations. The other **Brookstown Christmas Tree** occupies a valued position on our property at the corner of Yadkinville and Lewisville Vienna Roads. On November 23, we hosted the annual Community Thanksgiving Service, and held the **Annual Tree Lighting Service** afterwards, in celebration of the One who is the Light of the World. I am partial to the outdoor Christmas Tree, as the **Lighting** marks the beginning of the Season and the **Tree** serves as a daily "beacon" for all who pass our way. But mostly, I am partial to this tree because it is **a living tree**, **with roots**.

The tradition of our **Annual Tree Lighting Service** gains a bit more historical prominence with each passing year. The Brookstown Tree was planted several years ago as a family memorial to Pete and Jo Thomas, but in years to come will become the oldest and most significant public **Christmas Tree Lighting** for the Vienna Community. On the corner of highways that get busier and busier, our beloved living Christmas Tree bears witness to the **Light** which cannot be overcome by the darkness. May it continue to grow upward as its roots extend deeper and wider.

Brookstown Church celebrates the diversity of our **Family Memorial Trees** (each of us serves as a family memorial to our family trees)! Some of our trees have been local for a long time, while others have become local only recently. Our people originated in different countries and cultures, but we all share **ancient spiritual roots**. In Advent, our roots become more exposed as we remember those through whom we have descended. Easily remembered are our parents and maybe, grandparents; but the reality is that we come from a long unbroken line of God's people going way back! All the way back!

Advent focuses our minds and hearts on preparation, judgment, repentance, mercy and redemption. The roots of our faith remind us of God's redemptive work in His people, in us, throughout human history. But then, in Advent, there is the **STUMP**!

"Even now the axe is laid to the root of the trees. Every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire." ~ Luke 3: 9

In the New Testament, the axe is often a symbol of God's judgment; but the stump, the consequence of God's judgment in the Old Testament, is also a symbol of God's redemptive and restorative power through His people.

The prophet Isaiah did not have a Christmas tree. He had a stump, from which a shoot emerged. The stump "spoke" to Isaiah, and Isaiah spread the good news to the world:

"A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse; from his roots a Branch will bear fruit." ~ Isaiah 11: 1

The season of Advent is the darkest season of the Christian year, with the year's shortest day and longest night. Advent is a season of waiting, contemplation, self-reflection, and preparation for people of faith; but it is also a season of expectation of blessing, anticipation of God's work in and through us, and hope in the One who delivered us from darkness to Light. God created light from nothing. For nothing is impossible with God.

And from a family **stump**, God brought us the **Light of the World**!



During the summer, the Director oversees breakfast, snacks, and lunch, as well as outings and activities.

The Director is responsible for the hiring and training of staff, around 2-5 people. She/he is responsible for the safety and discipline of the children, as well as contributing to their growth and development in a Christian environment. The Director should be responsive and respectful to the families, and reports to the School Care Board. The church facilities must be used in a careful manner.

Salary will be based on experience, with benefits negotiable.
